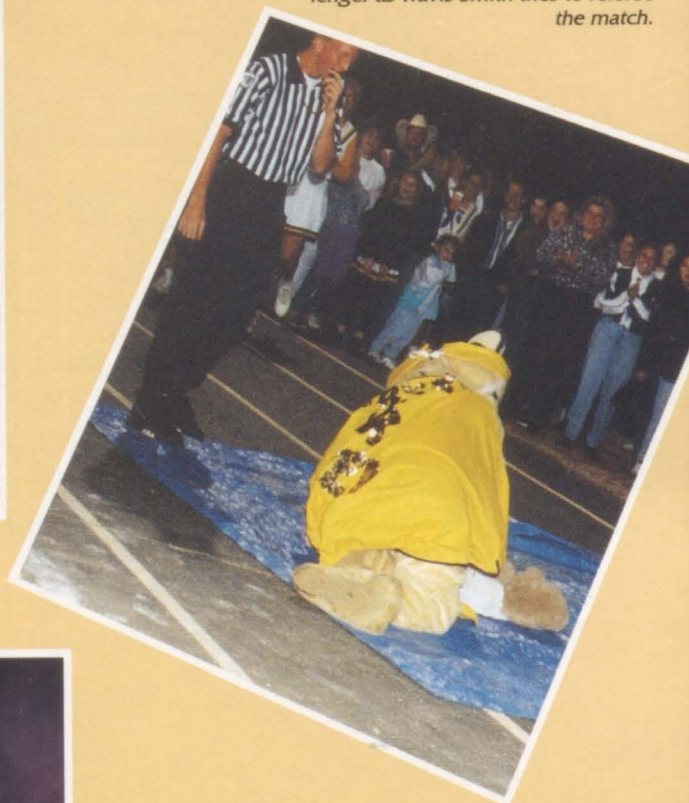

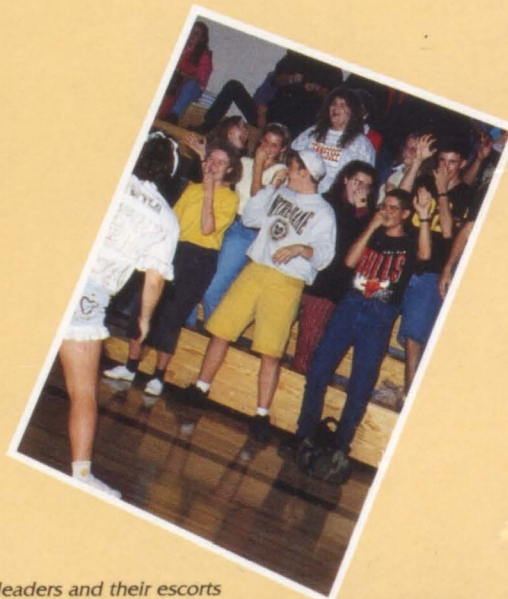

After the game, the homecoming dance was held in the cafeteria. The dance capped off a fun night that will never be forgotten.



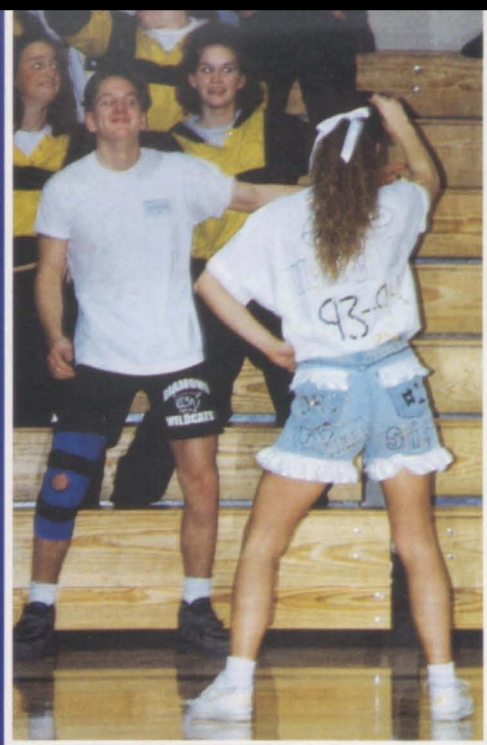

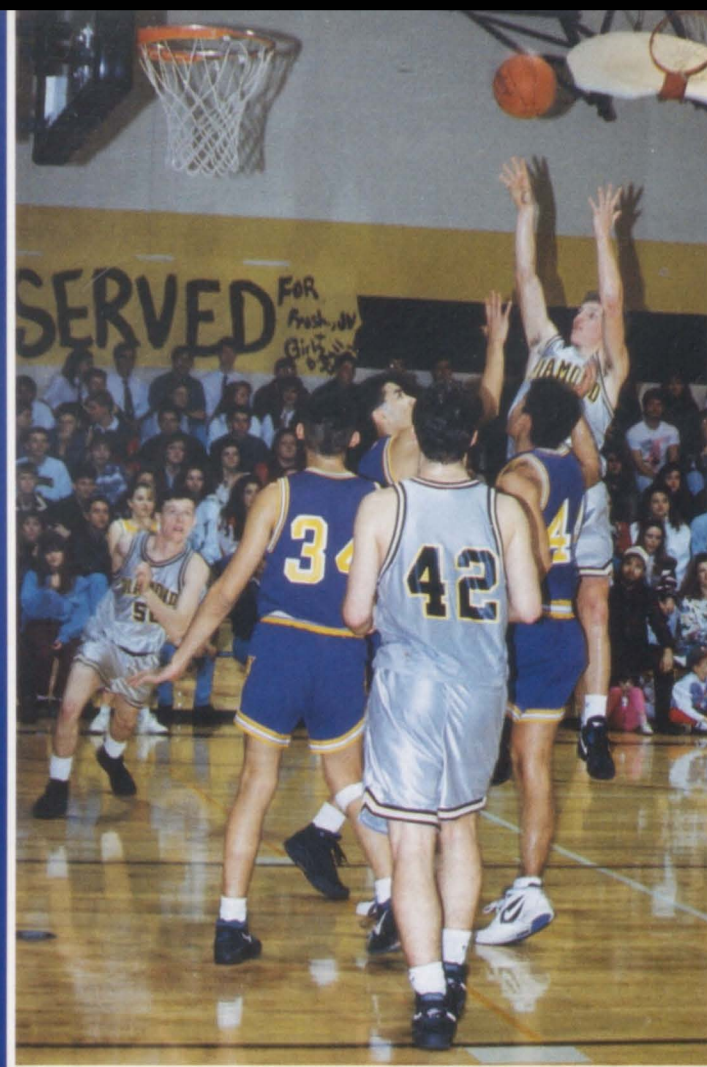

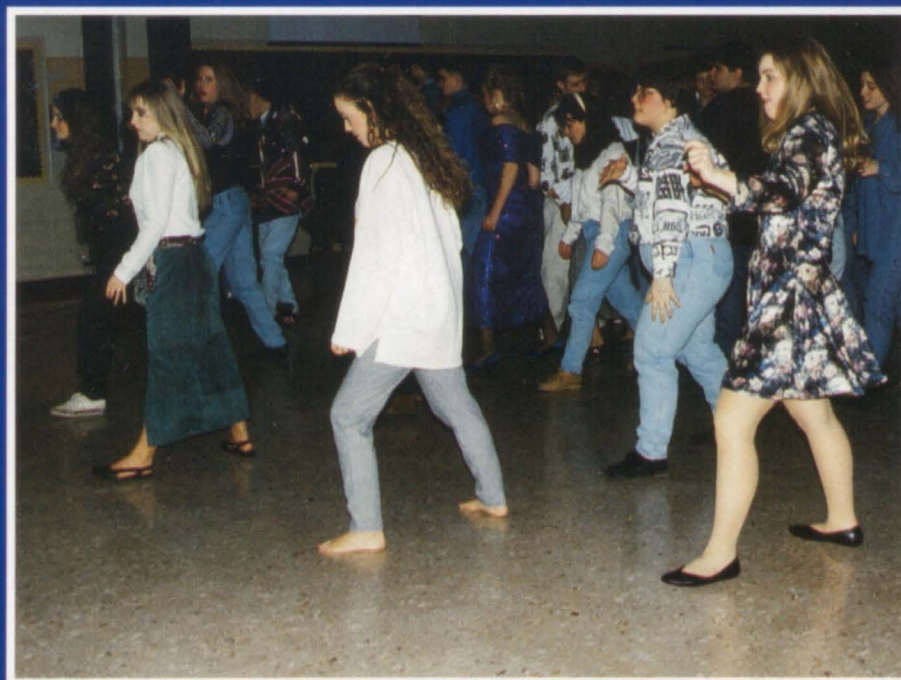

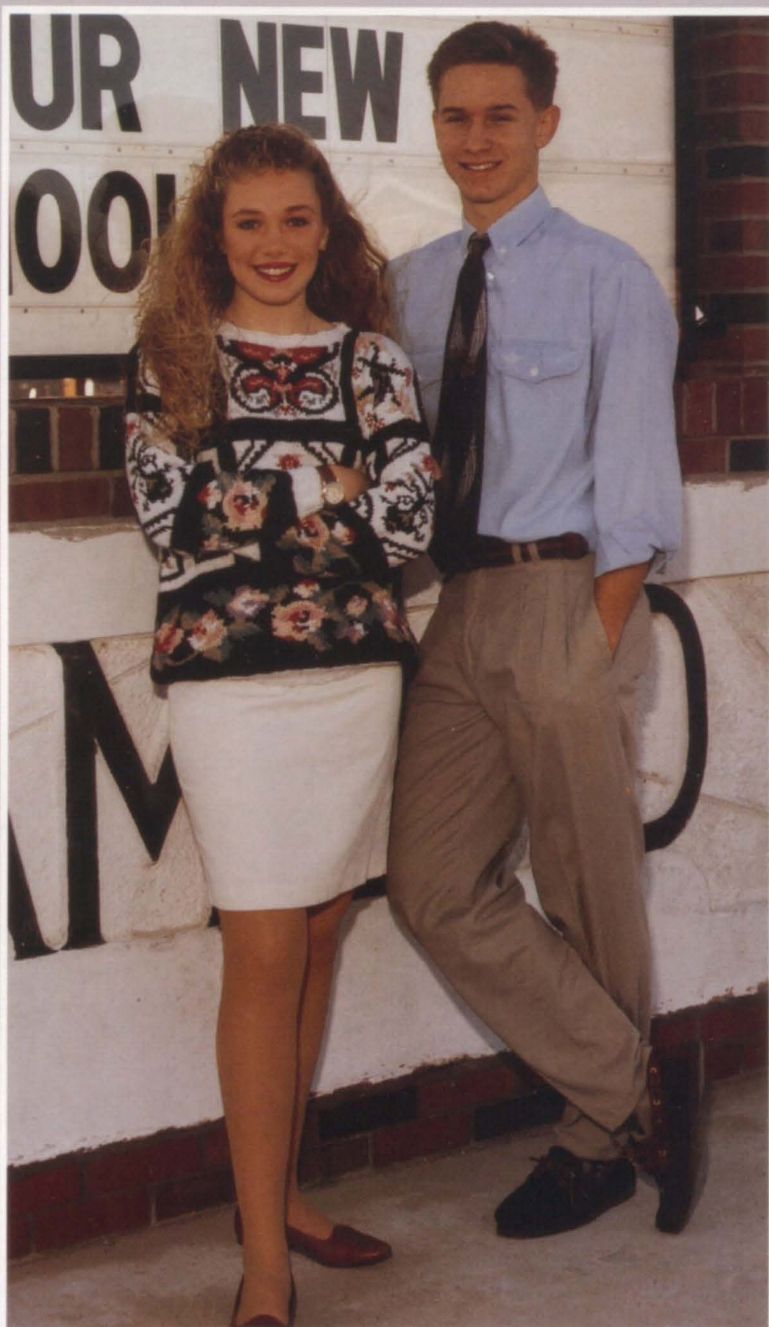
Who's Who students are nominated and later elected by the senior class. These DHS "diamonds" are examples of the best in each category.

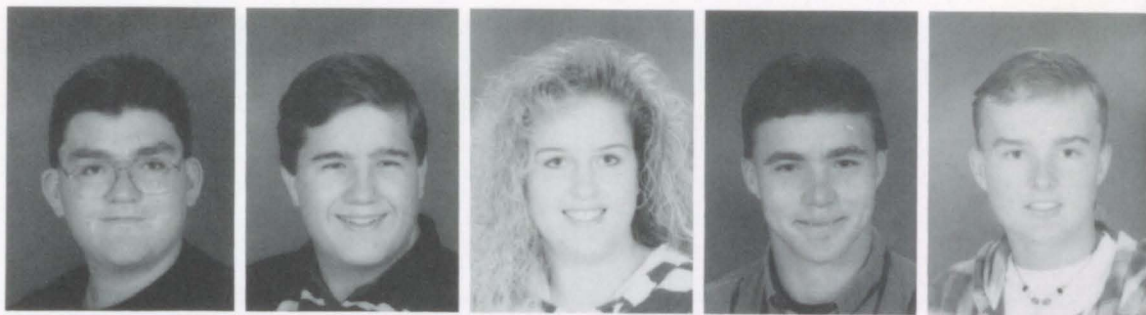

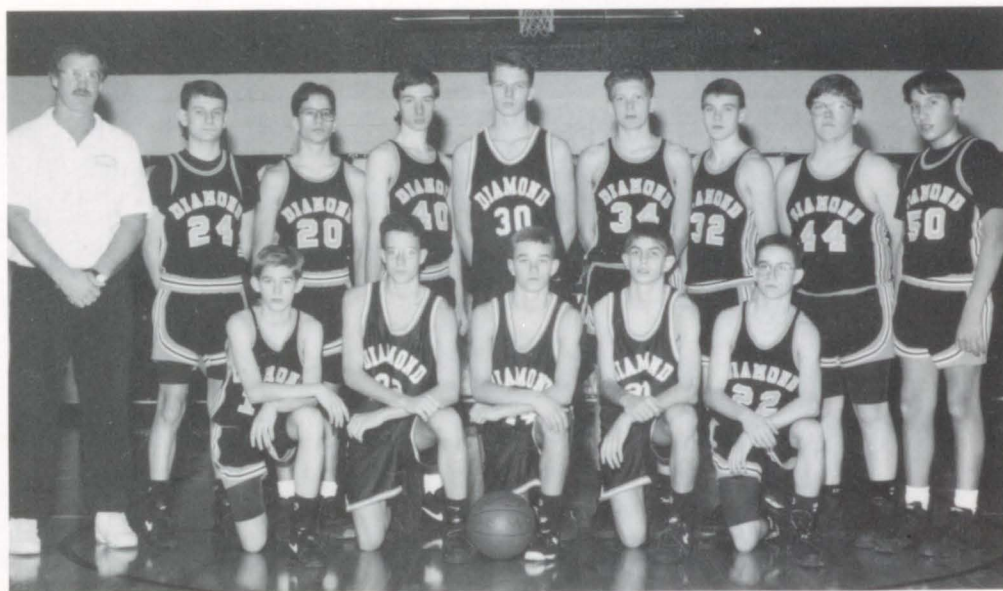

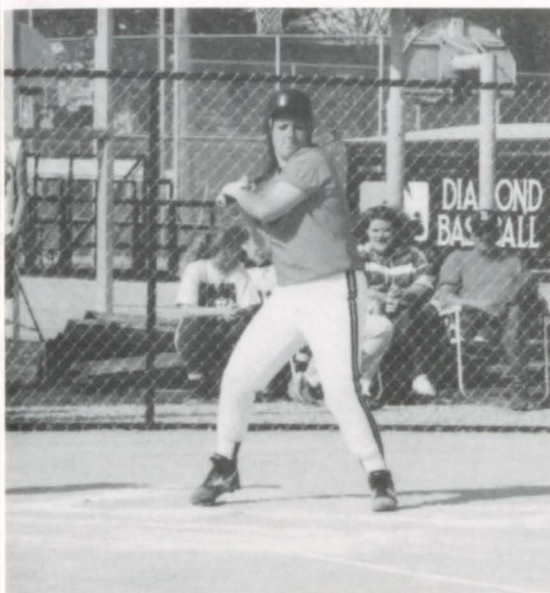

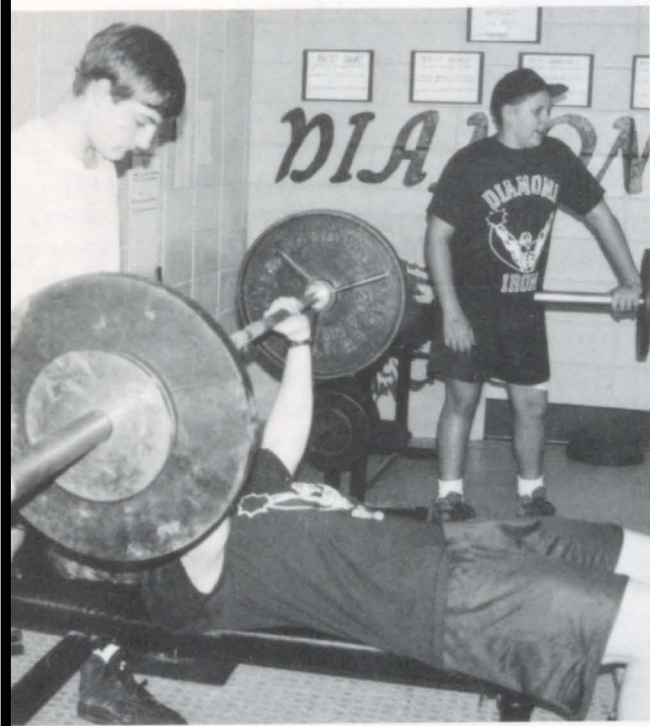

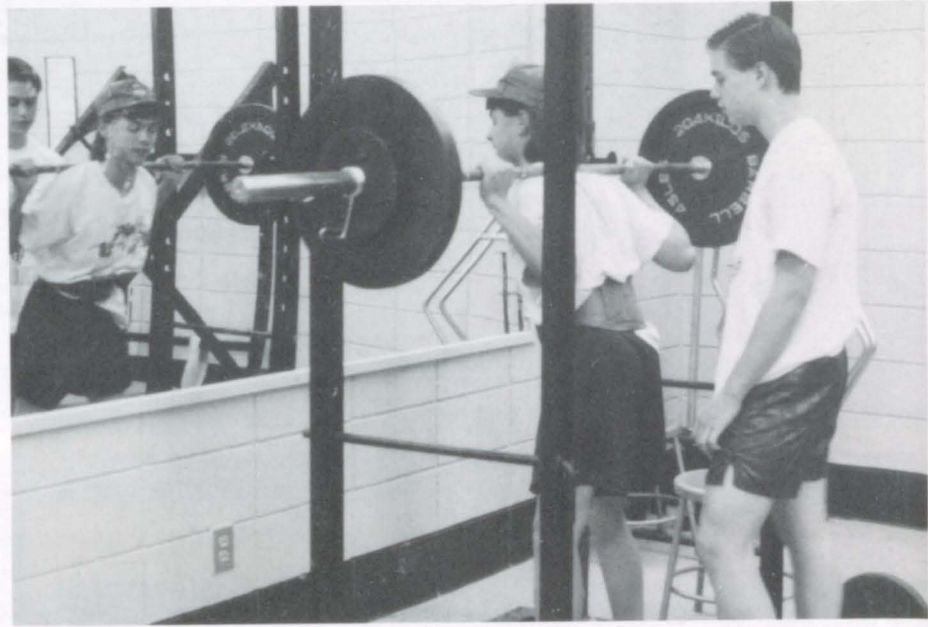

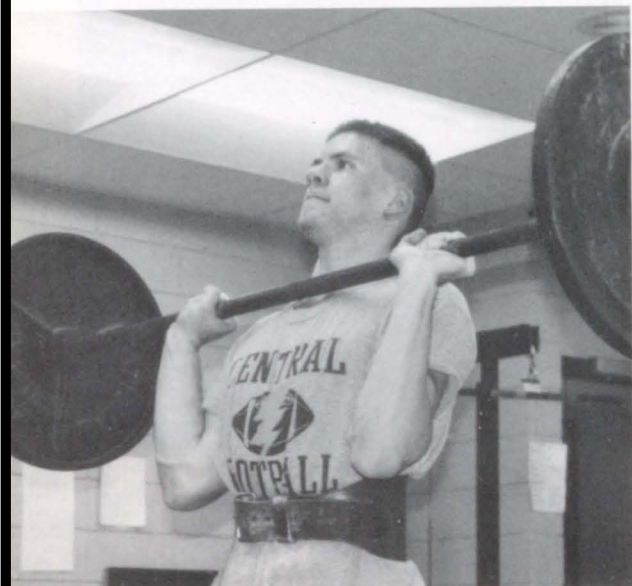

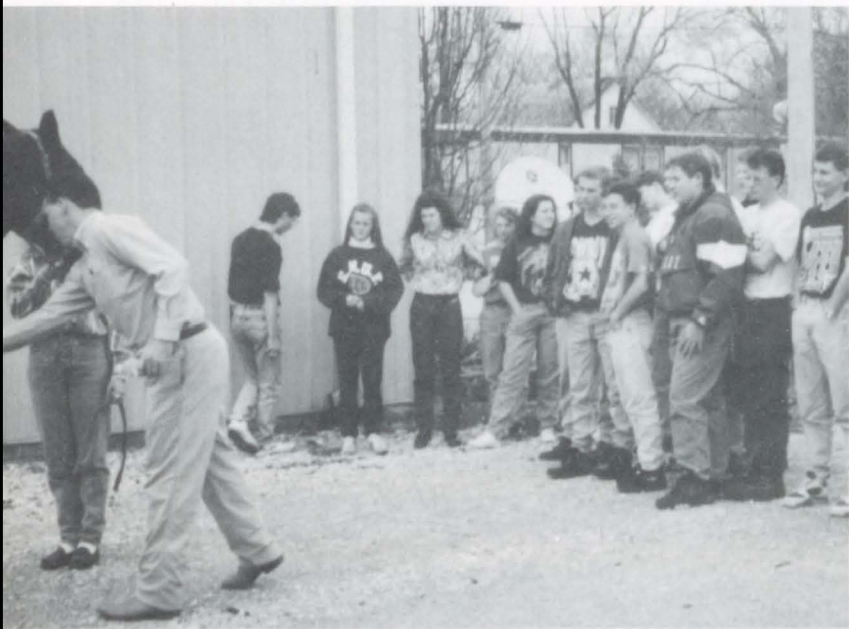

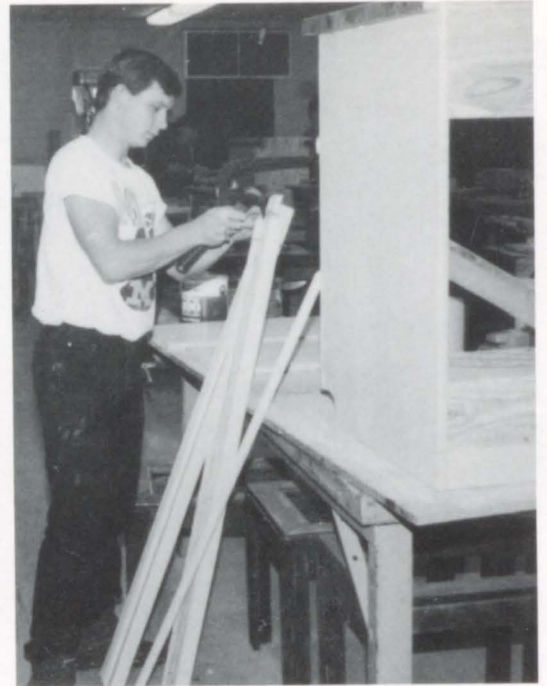

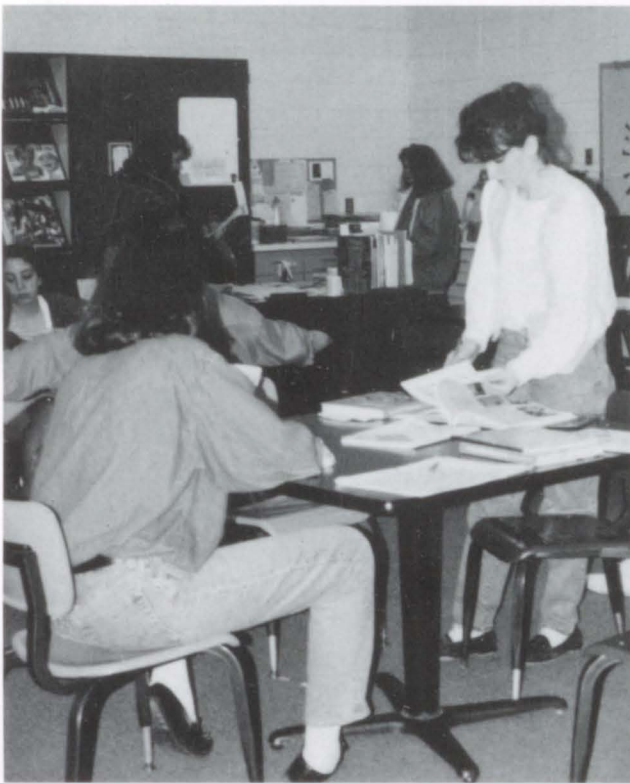

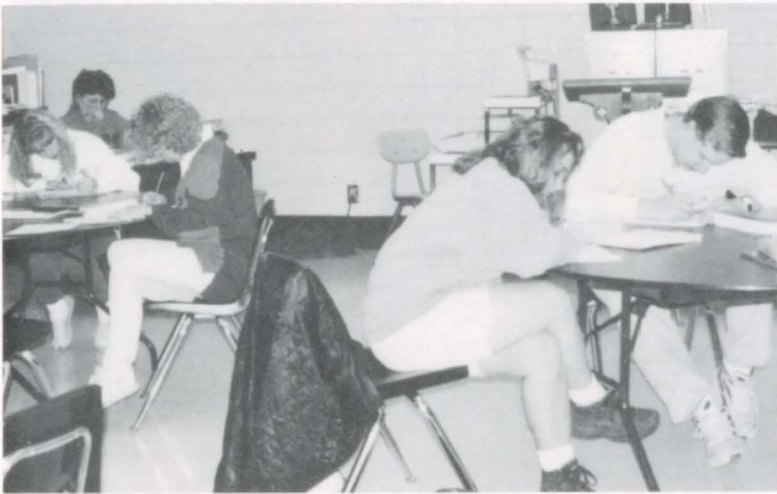

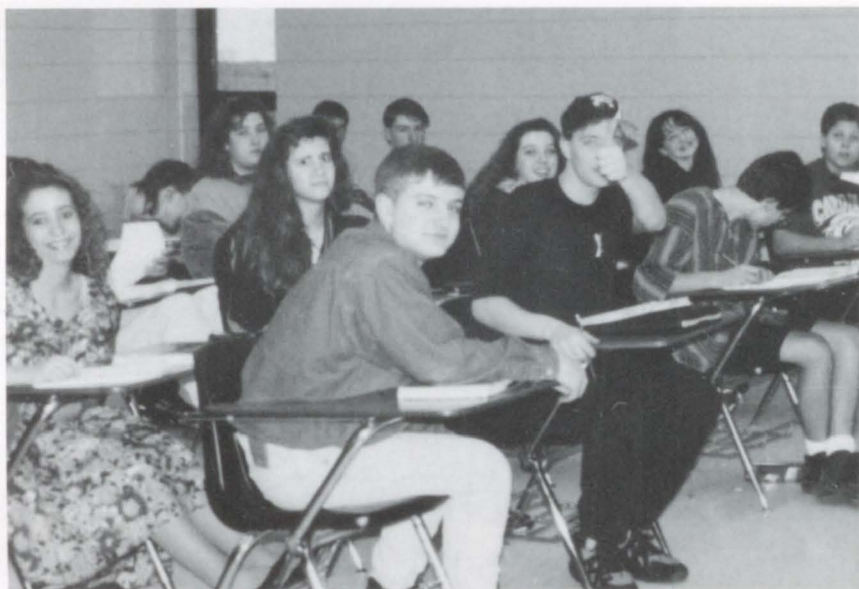

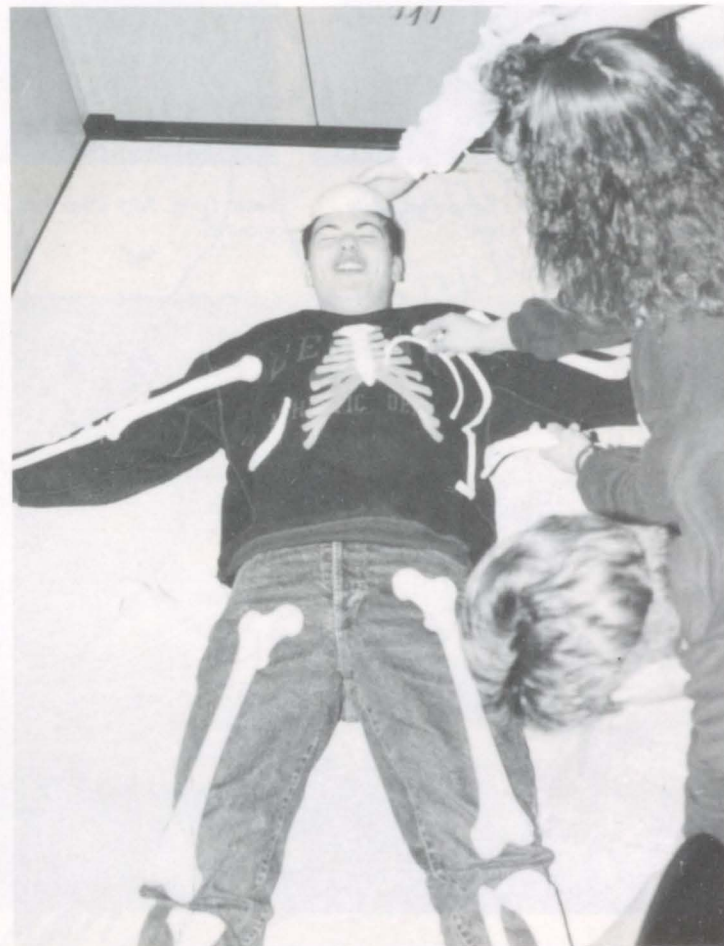

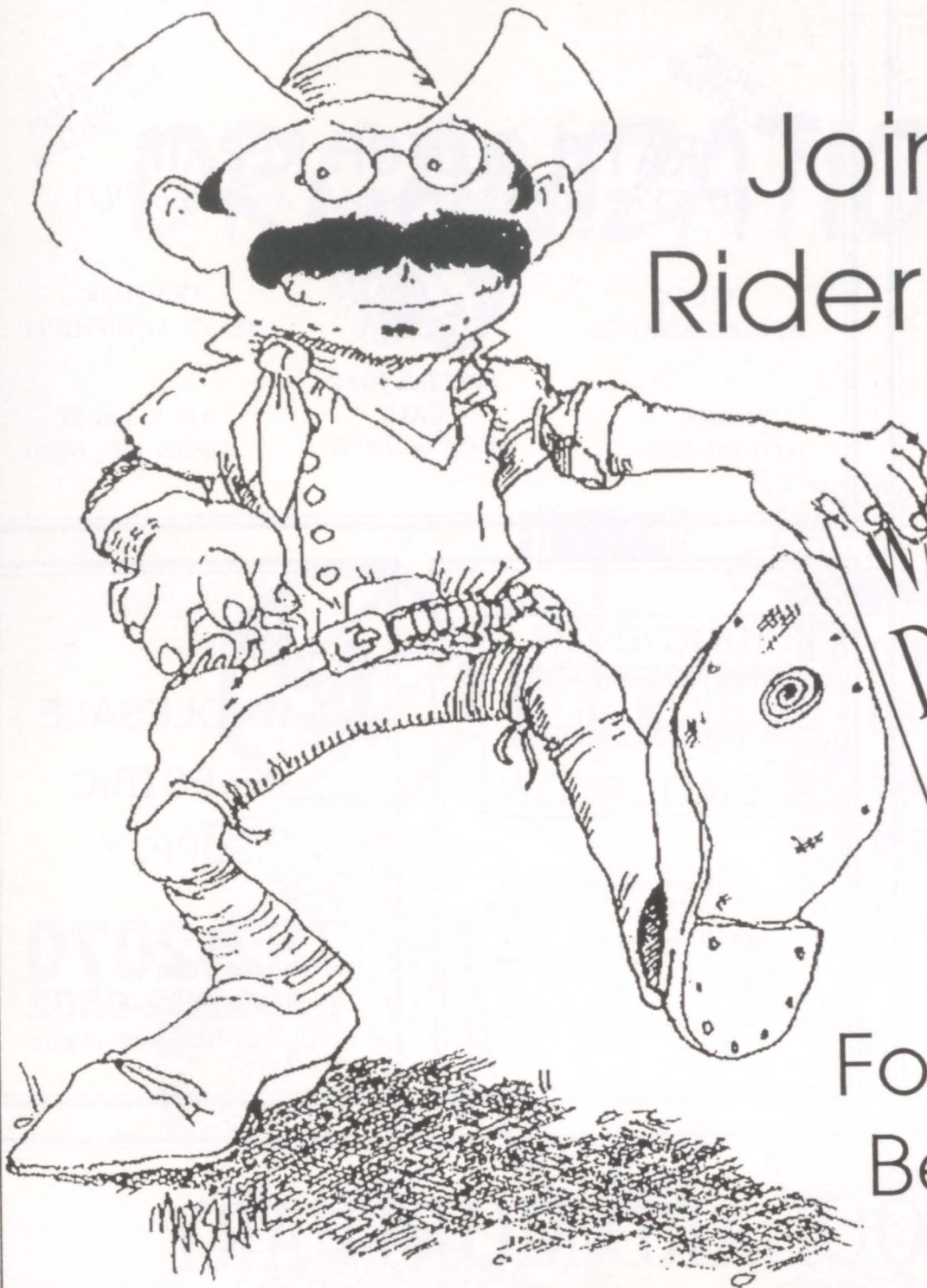

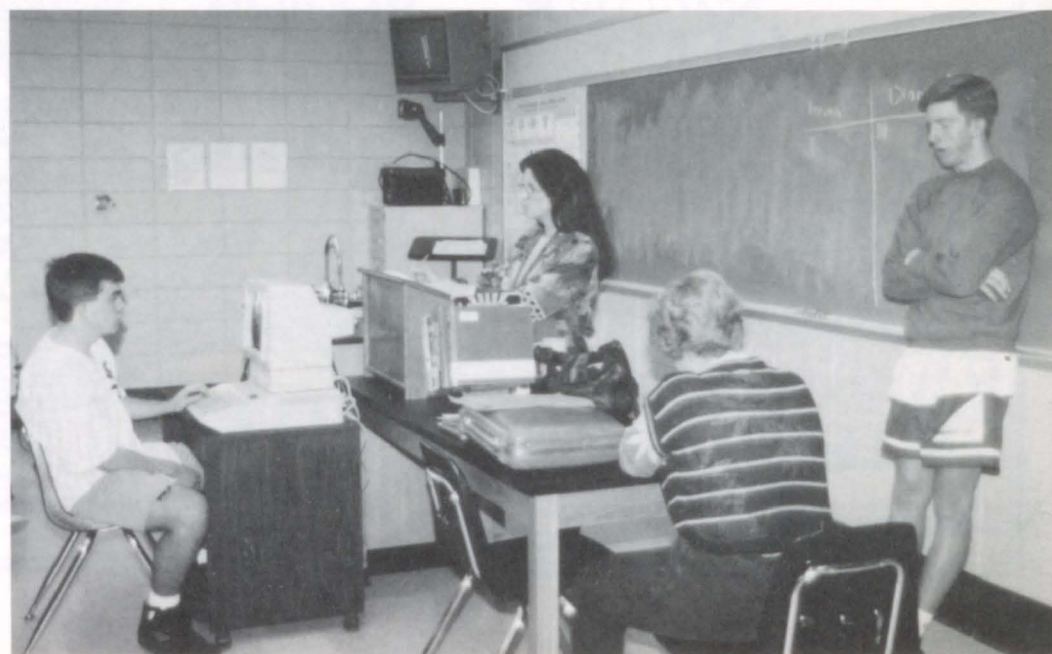

The Math League team achieved third place in the 2A school division.

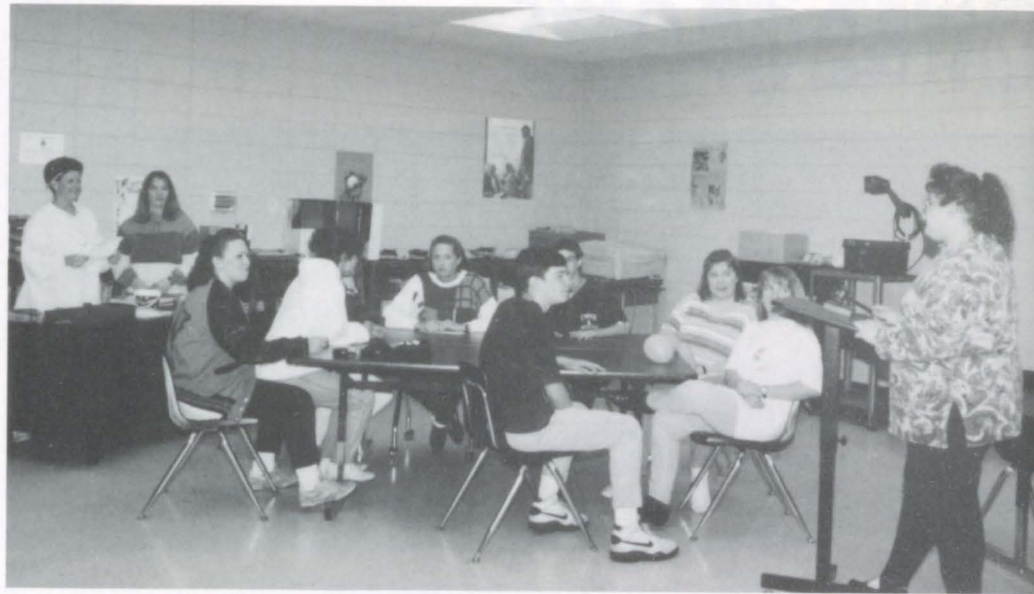

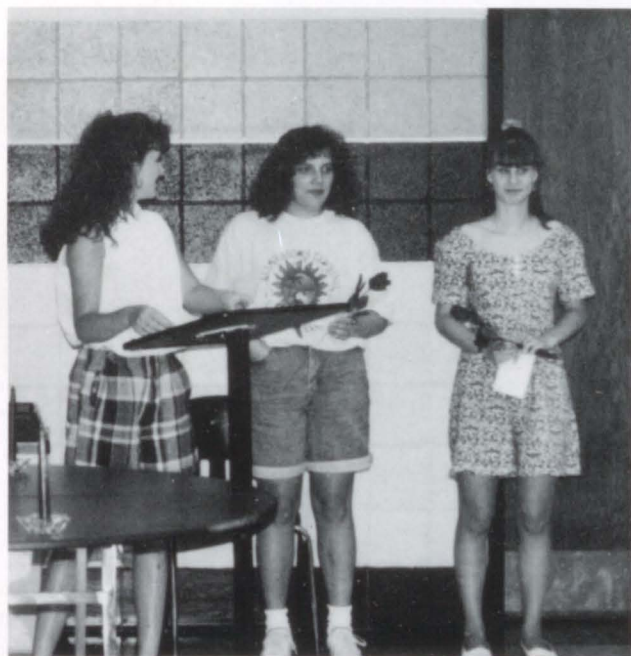

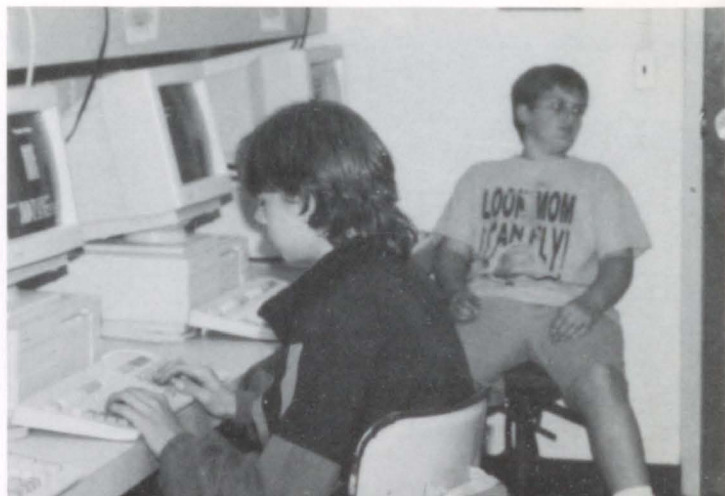

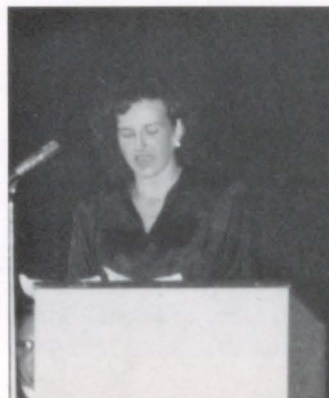
