





Patriot King and Queen





The 1984 Yearbook King and Queen were selected by the country-western group ALABAMA.





















The East Newton's Superintendent, Dr. Dalton Ham, acts as chief executive of the Administration of the Schools.

Mr. Russell Wilkie, Head of Transportation, and Mr. Andris, Administrative Director, help in achieving all services for our students.









Services Widely Appreciated
















Football Homecoming 1983
