
After a long semester of early practices, marching season was






and that they look up to me."



In parenting and child development, students learn of the demands and pressures of raising a family. Potential parents learn everything from how to provide the constant care that a toddler requires to letting go when the











Now, anyone that has











**Foreign Languages & Communication Arts**





Obesity is a major problem in high school students and adults today. At Seneca High School, health and physical education classes are required to help students with this problem as well as other health problems they might face in their lives.

The health class covers a variety of topics. CPR is covered by Coach Hodge and Coach Yust who help students deal with injuries and breathing. Ms. Hill educates students by promoting wellness in the physical, mental, and emotional areas of their lives. She teaches them how to be health-literate along with providing useful information about substance abuse and many other




topics. Students also do a dietary analysis and research family health history. In the family health history project, the students form a portfolio of past family health and diseases.

In the physical education class, Coach Naden attempts to teach the students team concepts and to "get our school district to exceed the state norms and national norms." In P.E. class, the students perform exercises that increase the cardiovascular capacities and help with coordination and strength; students also participate in a physical fitness test. 












