## PRIDE TRME

## Drafting:

Bronze and Silver card students are drafted to a teacher's classroom for three weeks. Gold card students are not drafted and, therefore, do not have to be in a classroom. Silver card students have to be in a classroom on Monday and Wednesday; they are allowed to travel on Tuesdays and Thursdays.

## Work:

When in a PRIDE class, students are expected to work on missing or current assignments. If a student does not have work, he or she is expected to read or study.

## When:

PRIDE takes place Monday through Thursday between 6th and 7th hours.

## Card Status Requirements:

Gold: A's and B's. Only one absence is permitted for the grading period.
Silver: A's and B's and C's. Two absences are permitted for the grading period.
Bronze: Any grade below a C or more than two absences per grading period.

## Gold Card Perks:

Gold card students have the ability to travel during PRIDE, but also are finals exempt (if they have consistently been a Gold card throughout the semester) and have opportunities to have supervised off-campus lunches. They, along with Silver cards, also are entered into a drawing after every grading period.

How to Play:
There are four rounds per game.

Round Four: Round four is a flashround. This means that the questions are easy but are asked quickly; teams must beat each other to the buzzer.
