After the 1985-86 season, wrestling at East Newton was cancelled, due to a lack of funds. But the wrestlers, their parents, and Coach Dave Allphin did not want to give it up; they worked hard to raise the needed money and the wrestling program was reinstated.

Although the team and Coach Allphin worked very hard, the 1986-87 team had a rough season. Many individual matches were won, but there was a lack of participation, which made team competition difficult. The team didn't win any meets, but some individuals were very successful. Five team members qualified for regionals, and two were able to go all the way and participate in the state meet.



## Soys Track <br> fearless . . . afraid of nothing.

The men's track team was very successful this year. The season began at the Carthage Invitational with EN placing second.

The big meet of the year was the Big 8 Conference meet where East Newton was tied going into the last event, the mile relay The team showed the EN tradition by beating Mt . Vernon in the relay and winning the Conference title, 133-127 for the second year in a row. A record setting performance by Scott Meadows in the 110 m high hurdles and in the 300 m low hurdles, erased the old records of 15.6 in the high hurdles to 14.16 and 40.1 to 38.27 in the low hurdles.

In the district track meet, East Newton's Big "T" (Tradition) edged out Mt. Vernon 82-80 for second place behind Miller.

These gentlemen qualified for the state track meet in the 400 m and 800 m relays: Scott Meadows, Mike Lamp, Jerod Swartz, John Neil Goade.

The seniors this year provided quality and leadership. The underclassmen showed vast improvement and promise for the future.
