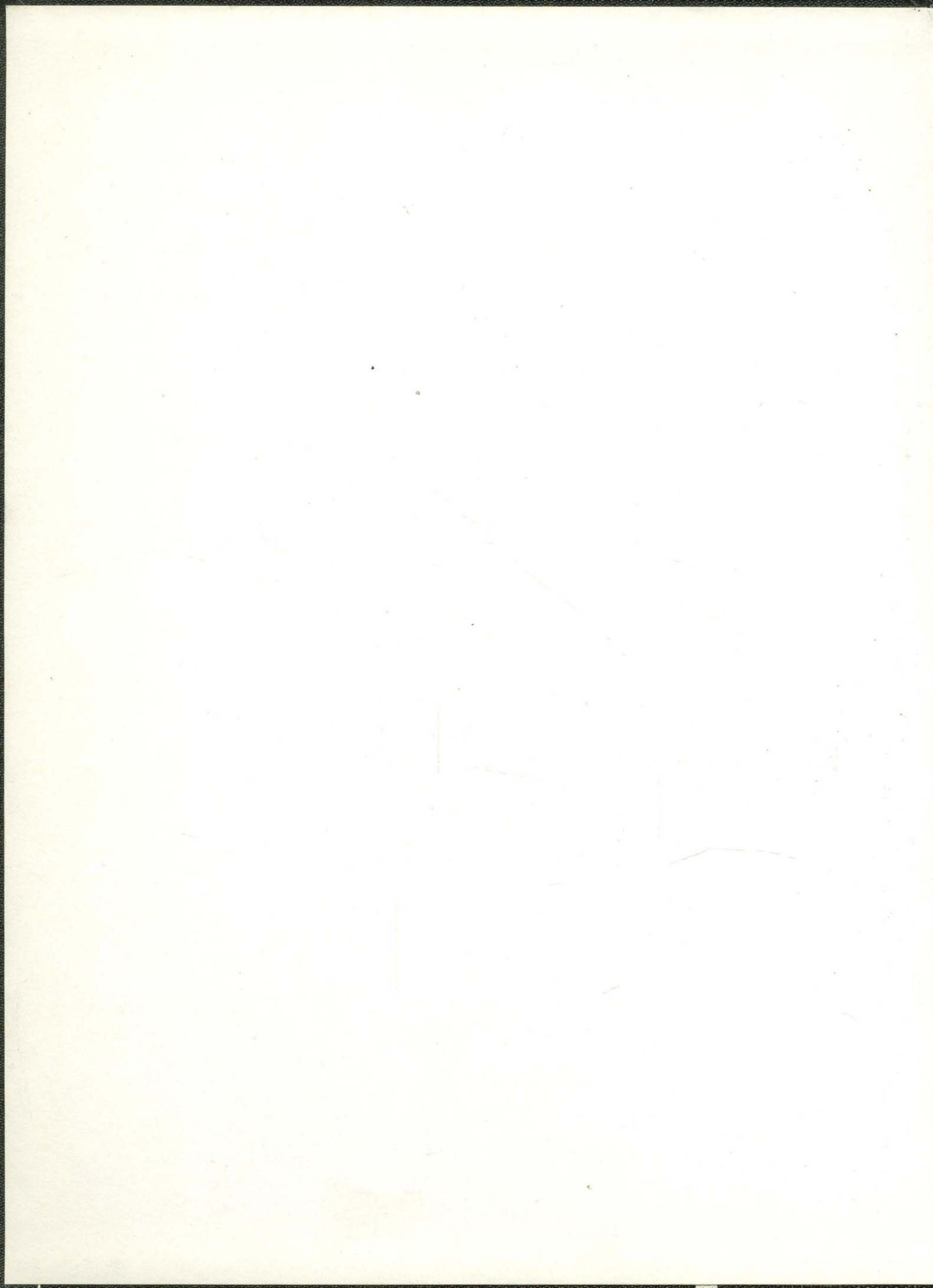

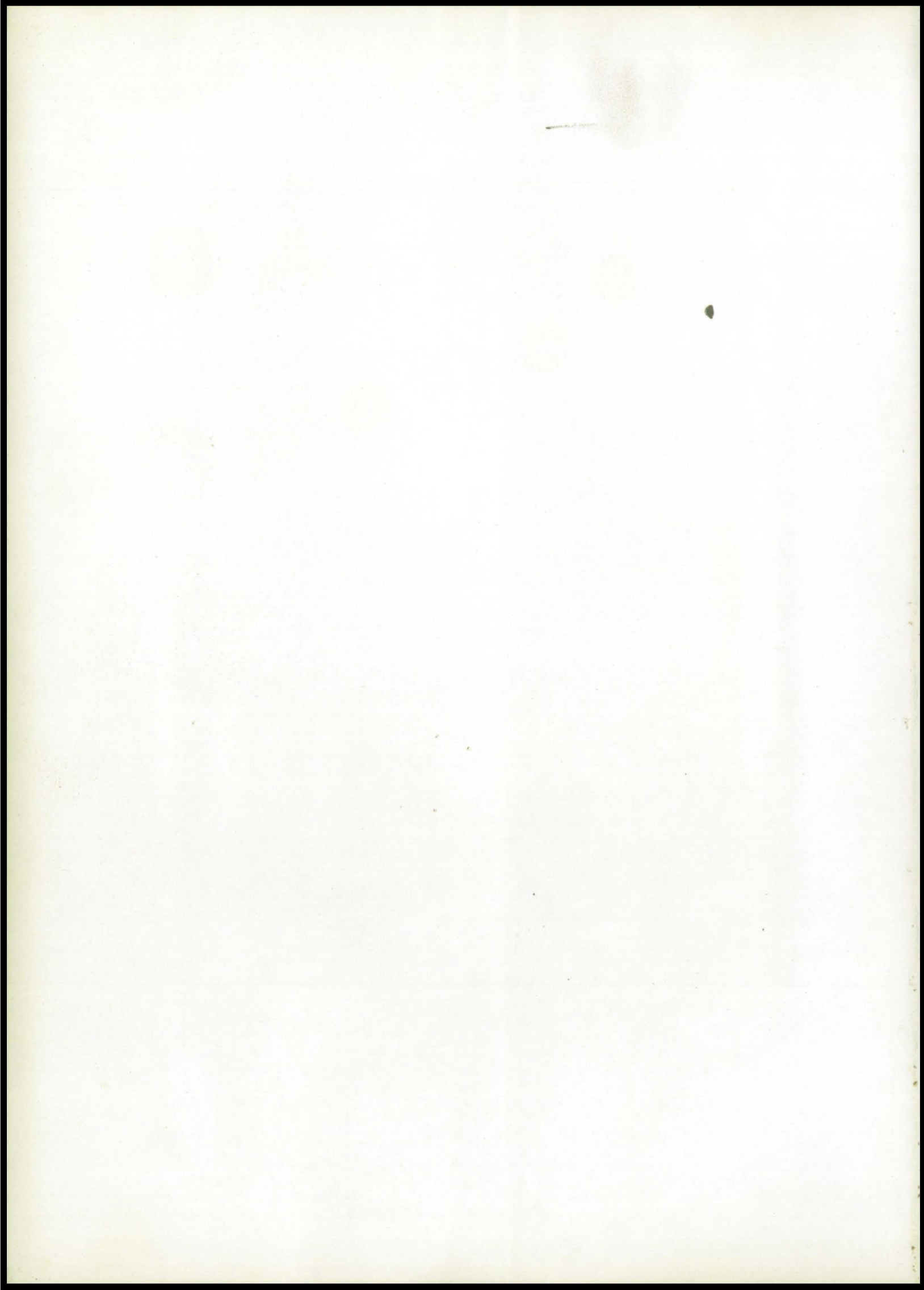

I am quite honored at being asked to select your queen this year. It was a very difficult task as every entry could well have been chosen.

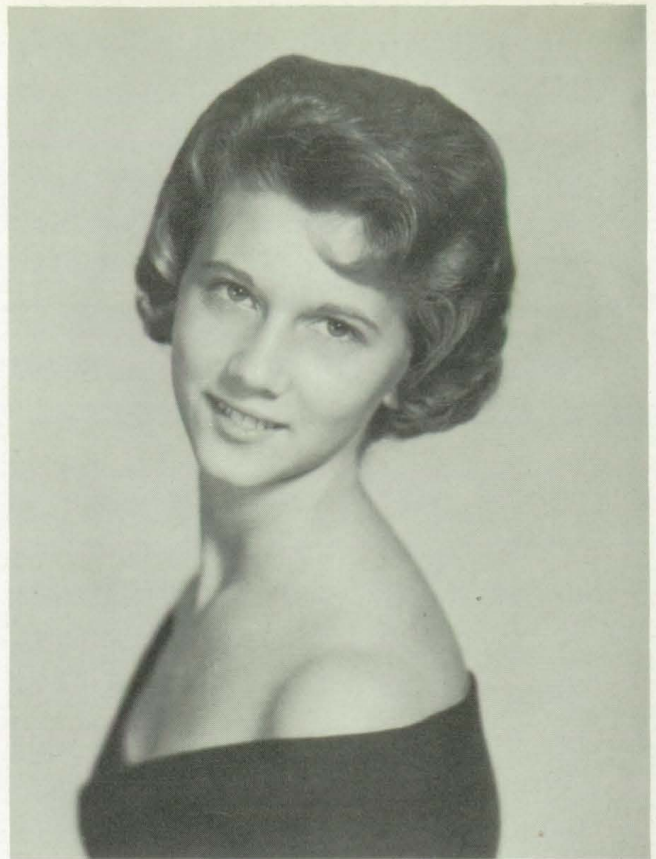

Traditional performances are conducted at the National Honor Society Installation, and for the Baccalaureate and Commencement Exercises.

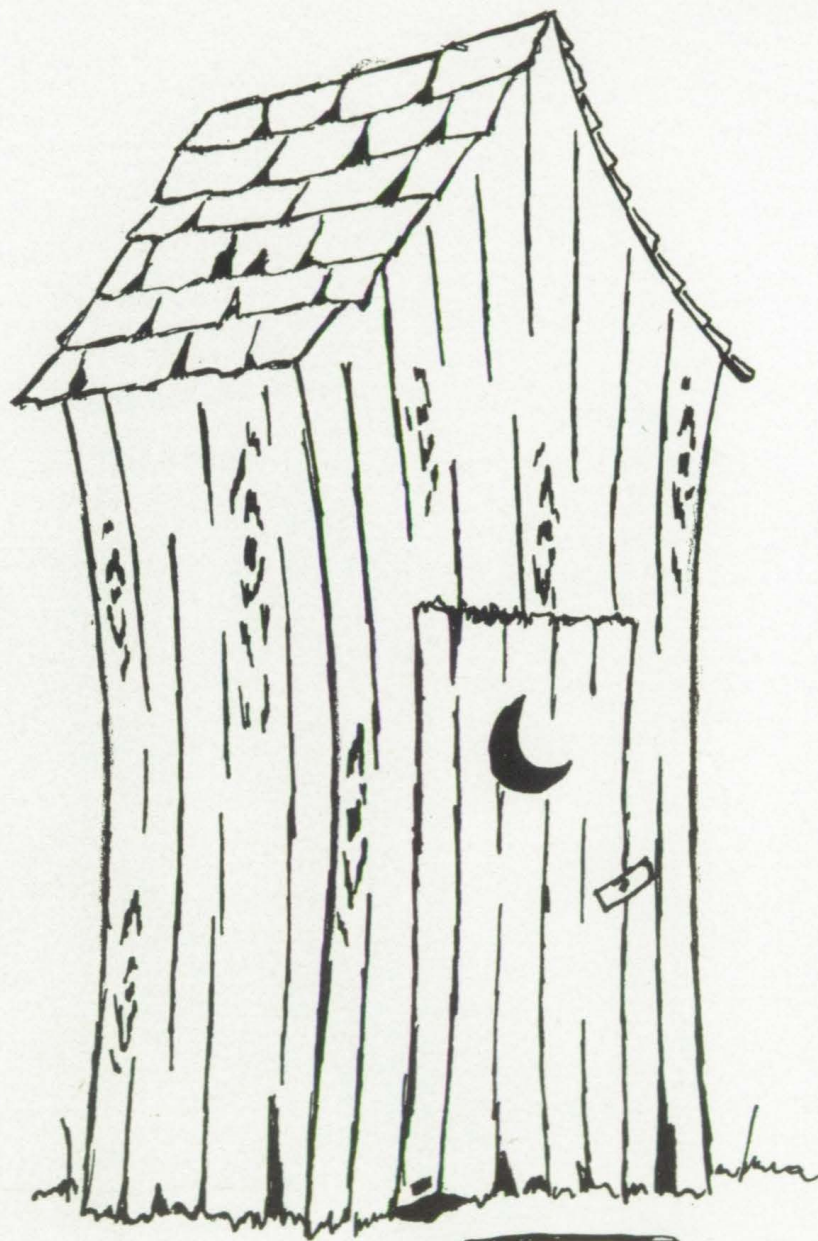

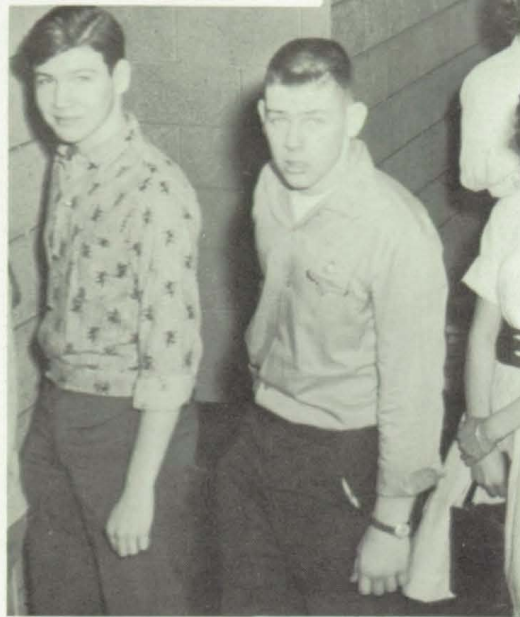

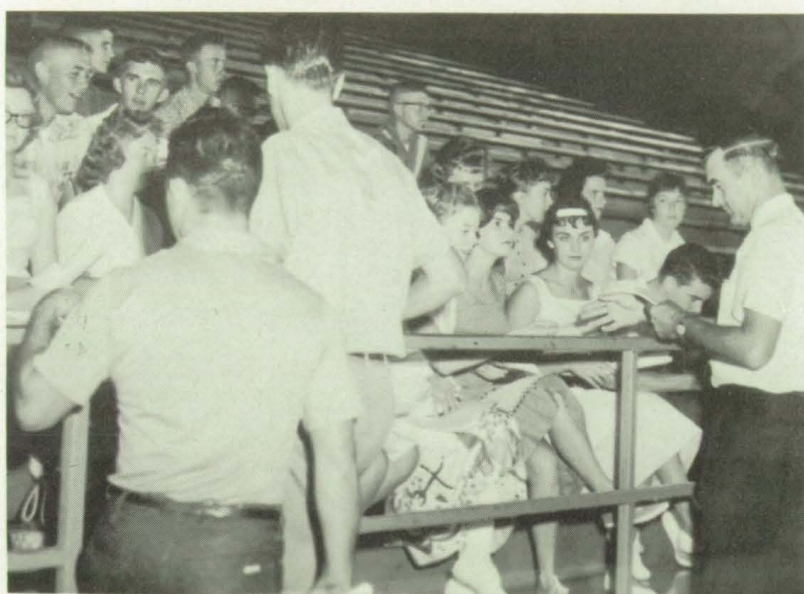

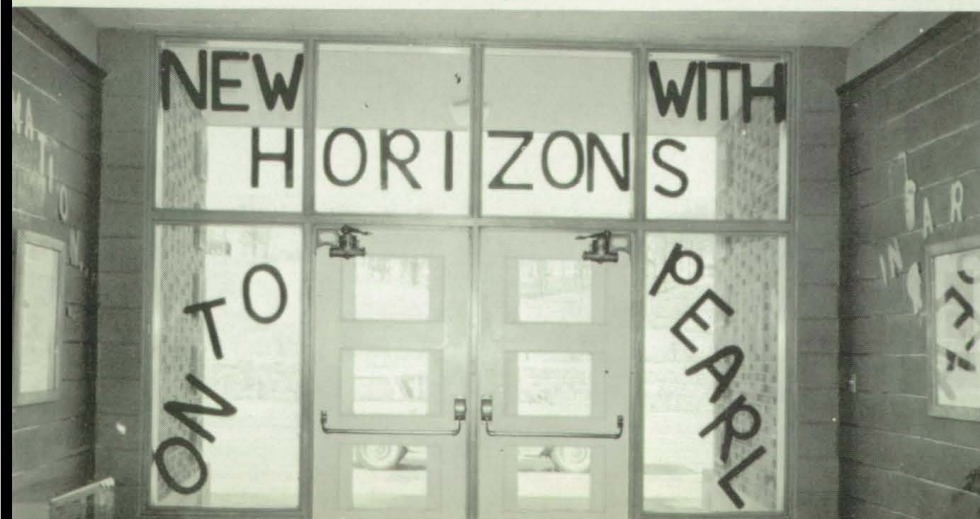

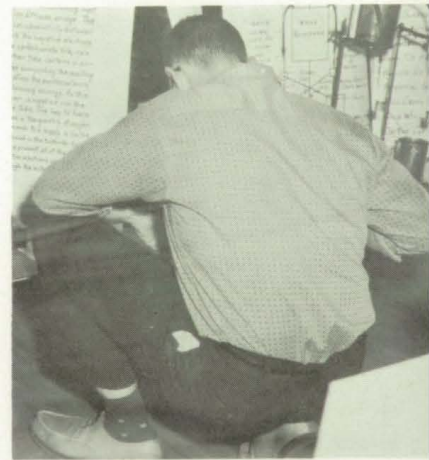
