A new course for N. H. S. Seniors this year is a combination of English literature and Contemporary Issues. Mr. Payne teaches the literature, while Mr. Johnson has the contemporary issues.

This training is of value not only to students planning to attend college, but also to those who will end their formal education upon graduation from high school.

The seniors enrolled in the course number 110. They meet in the school auditorium the third period of each day. Three days each week they study literature, and two days a week they hear discussions on contemporary American and international news events and problems.

In addition to the large class held in the auditorium the seniors meet each day in smaller classes for a regular senior language course, which includes intensive college preparatory work in composition, vocabulary, grammar, and developmental reading.


National Honor Society


