


















#### MIRRORED REFLECTIONS

When we look into a faded mirror, We see into the past: But the future has become even clearer, For it draws upon us fast.


We'll take a giant step one day, Or leap into tomorrow: We'll choose a path along the way, Leading to happiness or sorrow.

But once again the past has become clearer, Of lost memories left behind: That are found by looking into a faded mirror, Reflected within our minds.





# Bright Lights Shine On The Best Of Broadway









Music for the night was provided by Barnaby Finch. Prom was dedicated this year to the Senior class of 1980.




Just before taking the big step forward, the 8th graders can look back on the year 1980 and proudly say, "We came through".
