Tropical Treasures



This year's theme was "Rocky Mountain Christmas." The cafeteria was decorated with silver stars, velvet bows, and other various country items.





Directly after the game, current and former E.N. students enjoyed the dance in the gym. This year's theme was "Hollywood Pizzazz."












Everyone enjoyed dancing to the music of 94 KIXQ and crawling through a maze of 450 bales of straw.







The ballroom was decorated with blue and white streamers hanging from a silver ball. White balloons with silver icicles and stars covered the bay window.


The refreshments that were served were a variety of cheeses, croissants, finger sandwiches, punch and cola.

The dance turned out to be a great success and the Seniors would like to thank everyone involved.





Although on the scoreboards they were 13-10-2 in the hearts of the coaches, the players, and the fans, they were undefeated.











Taking a Shot






















Superior Sowers


A Splash of Color
