Following the ceremony, the Patriots played with great effort against Mount Vernon but were defeated 48-27.

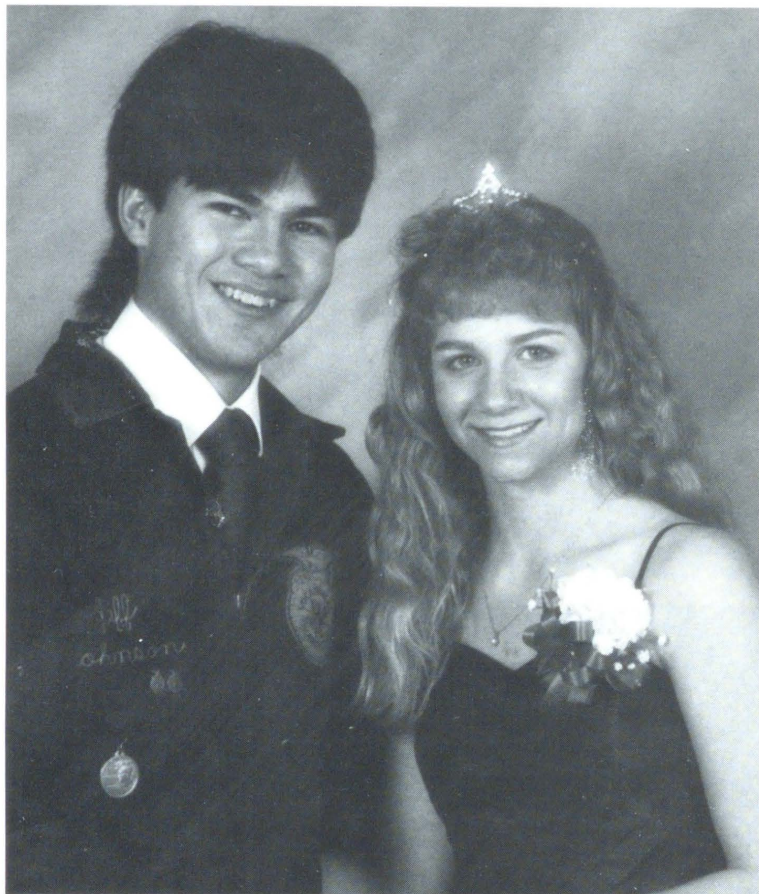

The refreshments that were served were a variety of cheeses, croissants, finger sandwiches, punch and cola.

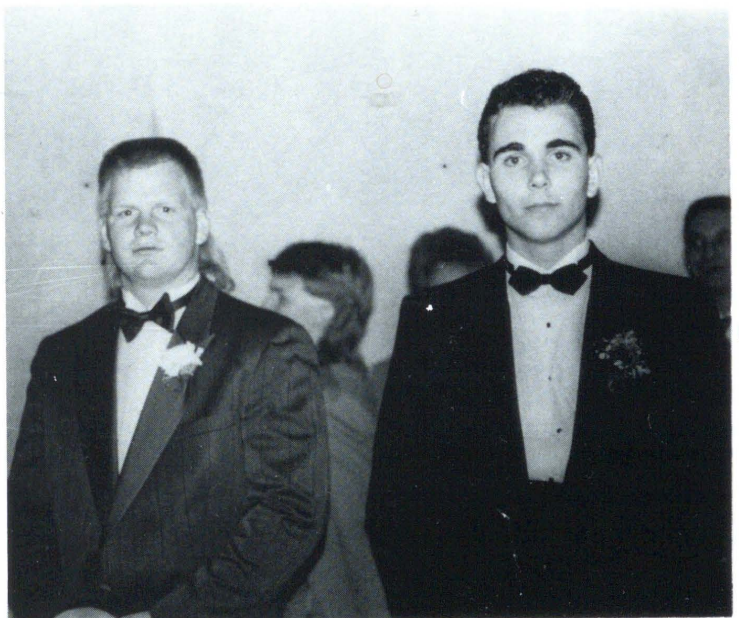

The Chapter received State Silver BOAC, Superior Overall Chapter, and 100% Chapter.

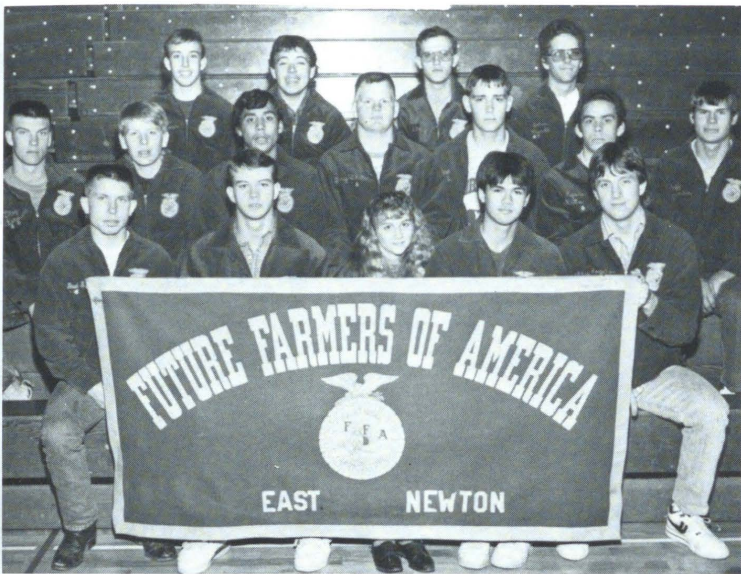

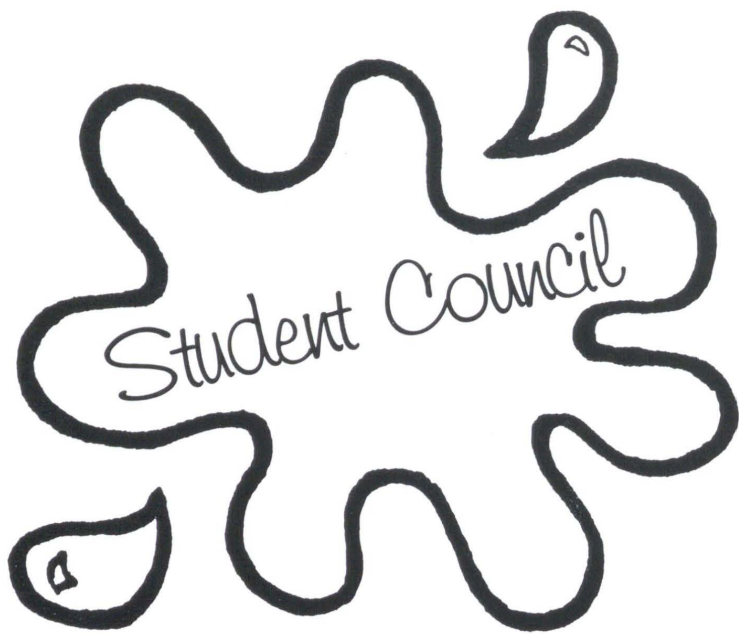

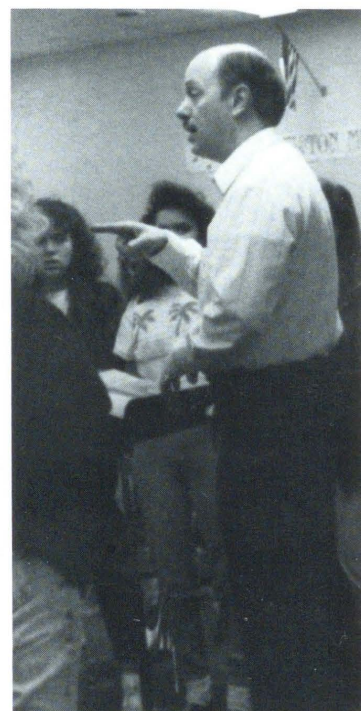

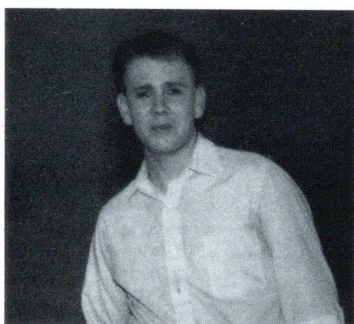
