## On the Net!

NHS Cruises onto the Information Superhighway! It was full speed ahead for the Neosho School District as it found its way onto the WWW. Students and teachers all over the district found they had access to information they didn't even know existed. Some participants were only "lurkers" while others surfed their way to being a regular "netizen". The JH/SH complex had a computer in every classroom and three labs all networked to a server that took off through a 56 k line to the Internet. The MS was networked during the $95-96$ school year and the elementary schools had access through a single computer at each building, making access available district wide. Several LAN's were in place and we were on our way to a WAN.
Many students were linking up at home through JANICS, a community network, or other services that were starting to become available in the area. They created their own web pages and corresponded through the use of email, forgetting in many instances that "snail mail" even existed. Email is one of the most popular uses of the Internet. R-5 had its own email server with each teacher and administrator having email accounts. Students used teacher's accounts for research, etc.
The IA Department began producing the Wildcat News in a Graphic Tech Class. Each Thursday the school announcements were broadcast. By the end of the school year, the local cable company, Cable Com, had provided a 24 hour channel soley for school use. Students in the Computer Science II class created a multi media presentation that would scroll continuously on the channel when school activities were not being broadcast. These same students created the R-5 website and spent many hours throughout the year on development.

Instead of putting up firewalls through software like Cyberpatrol or Cybersitter, students and teachers were expected to sign a Use Agreement if they wanted to use the district network. Everyone was expected to exercise appropriate netiquette and only access sites that were educationally appropriate. By remembering the rules of the game, users could avoid being flamed and losing access rights.

Our onsite Guru, Judy Manhatton, kept everything up and running and fixed everything that no one else could figure out. It was a challenging and eventful year in technology.
