...Marge the janitor walked in on Bryan and Lindsay in the kitchen kissing during their sophomore year.

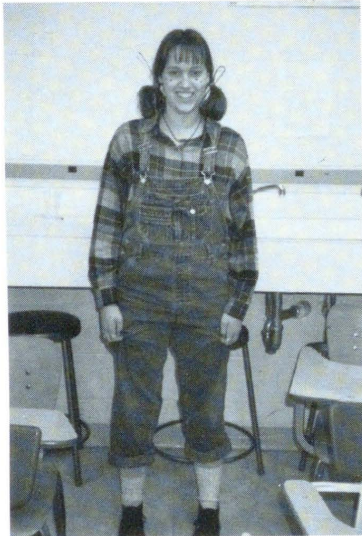

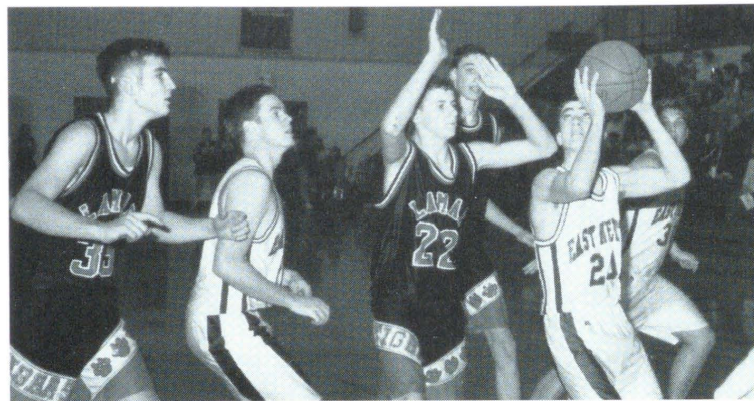

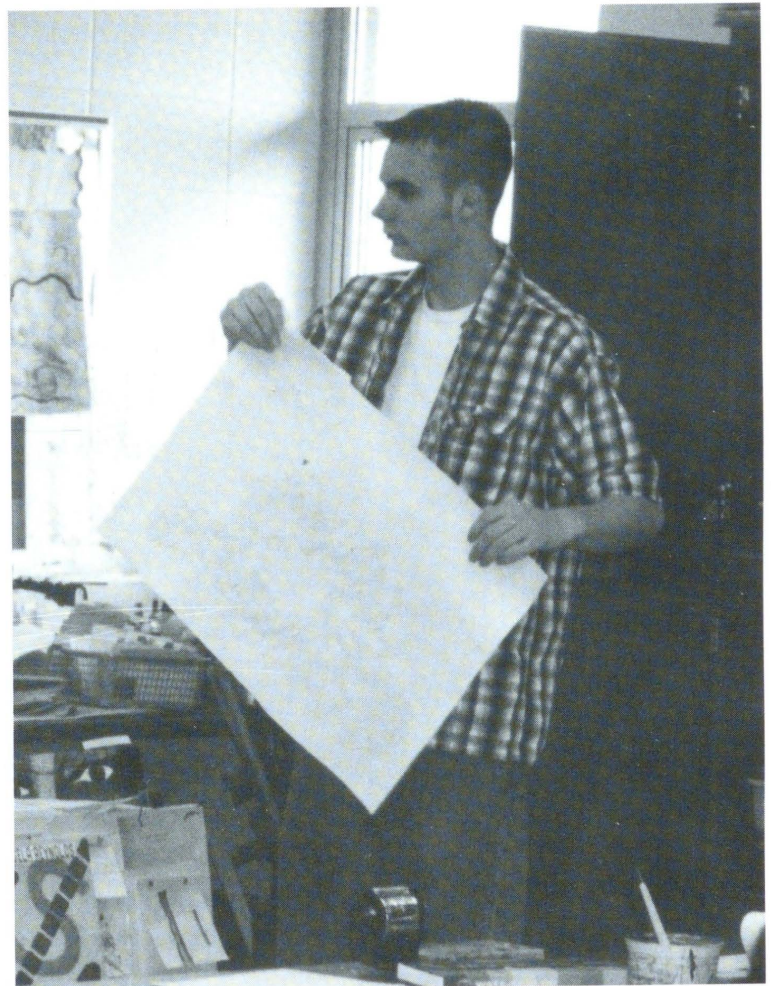
When asked who her favorite painter is, she replied, "There are so many artists that are good, it's hard to pick one out, but if I could only pick one I would say Van Gogh."

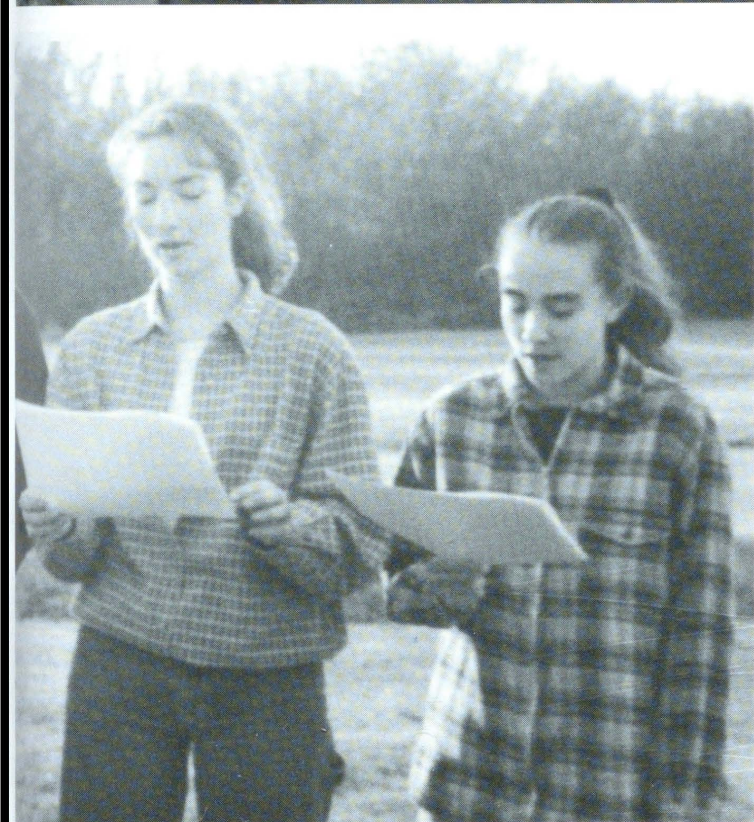

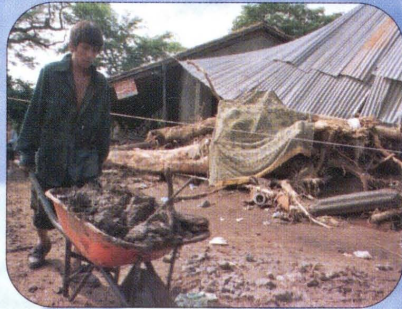

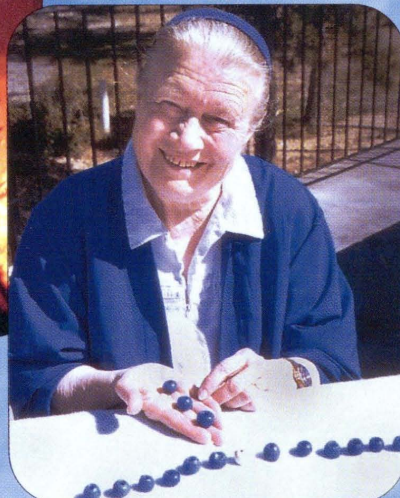

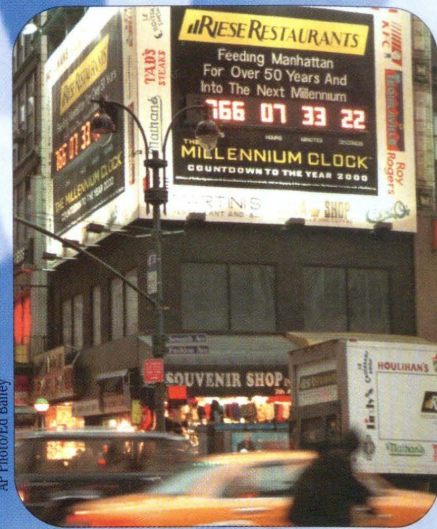

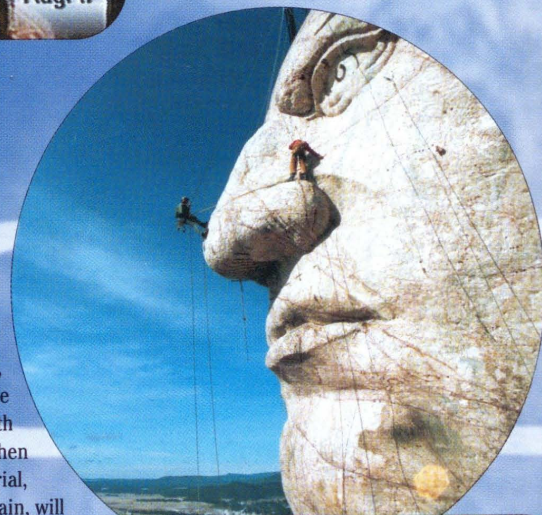

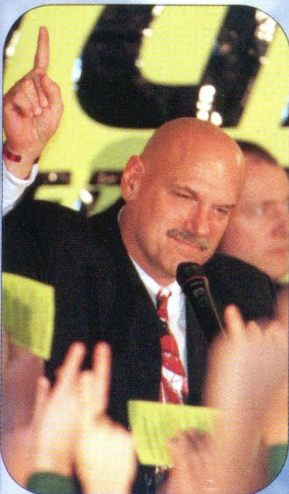

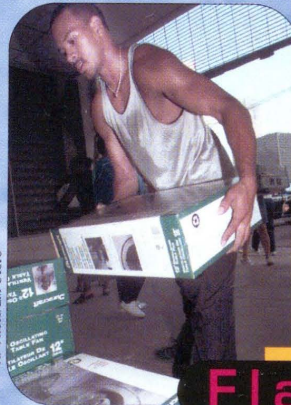

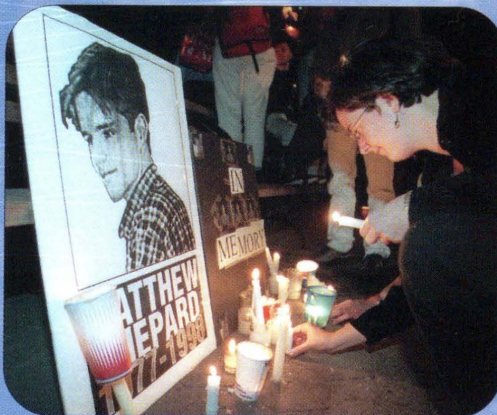

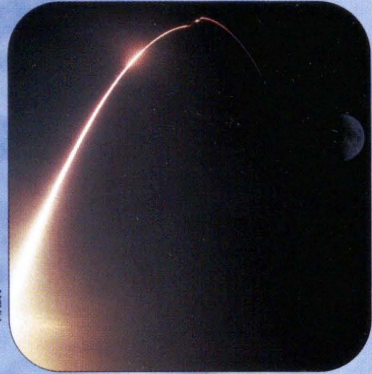

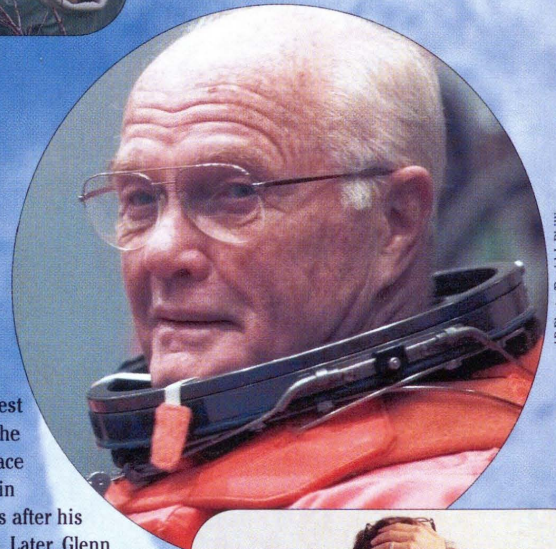

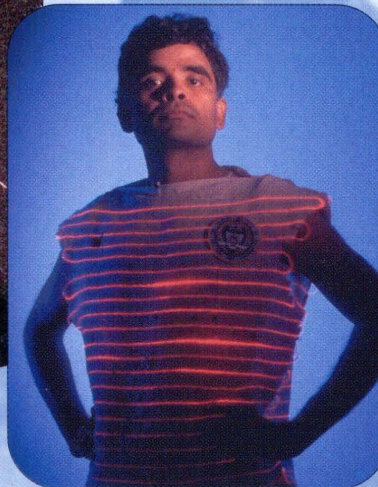

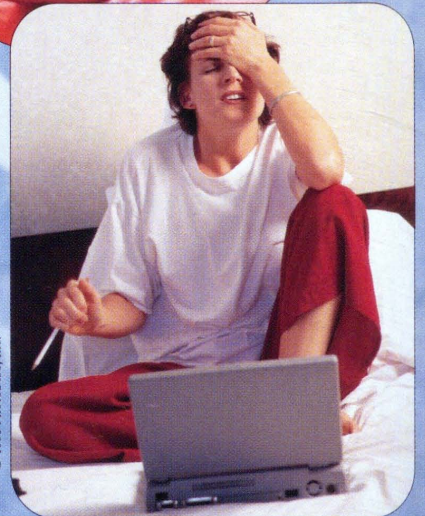

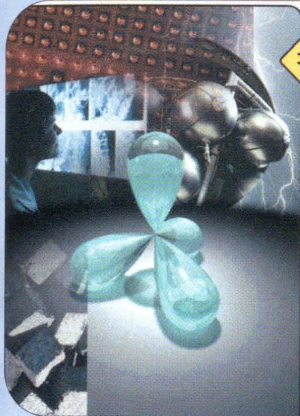

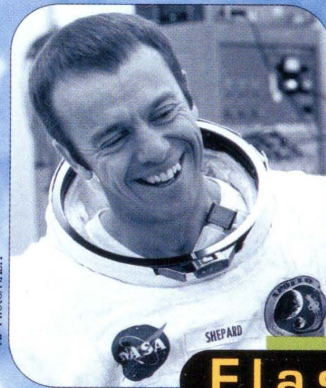

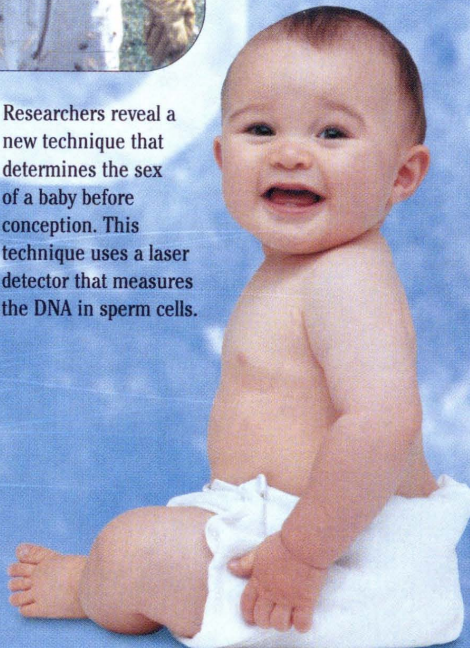

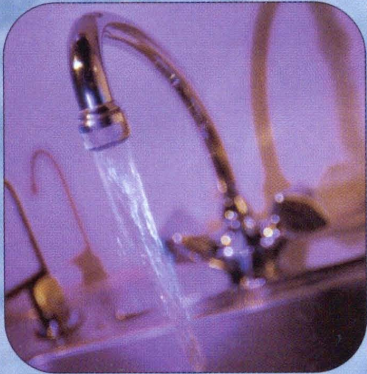

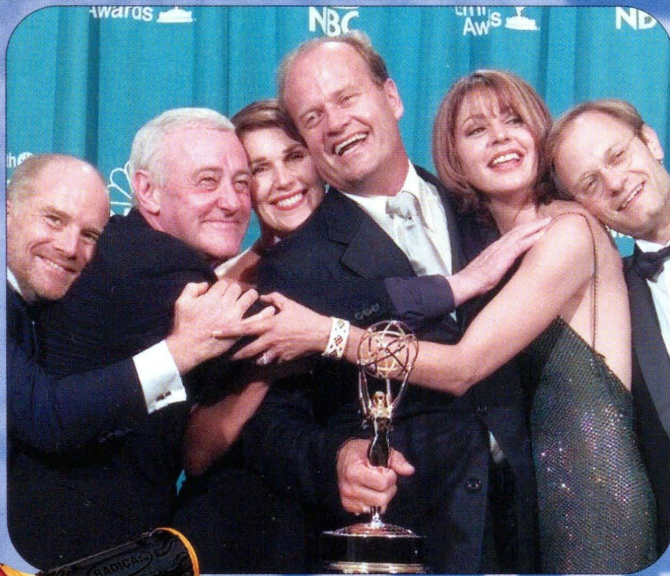

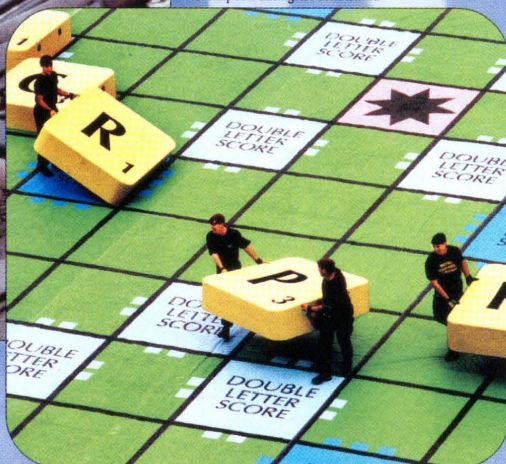

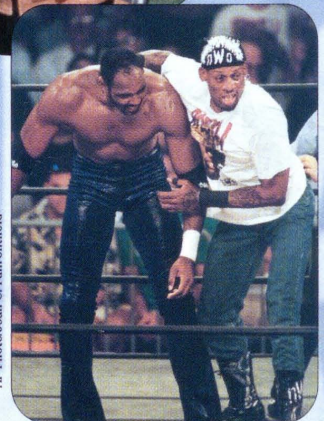

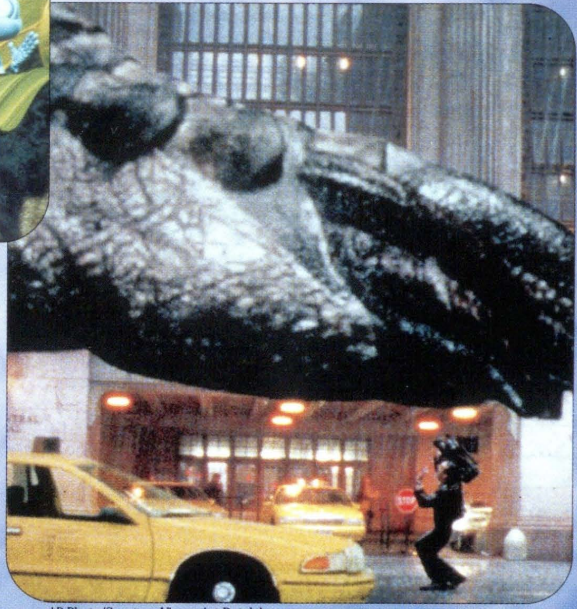

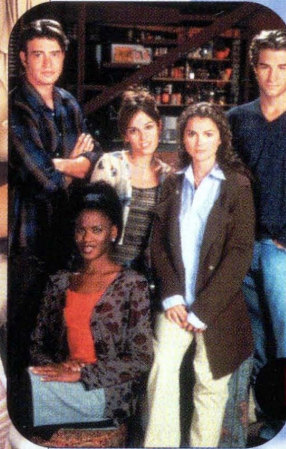

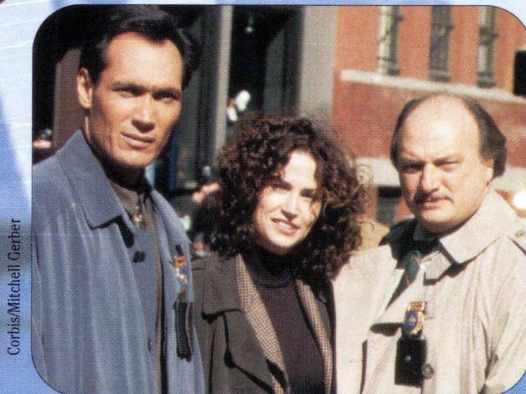

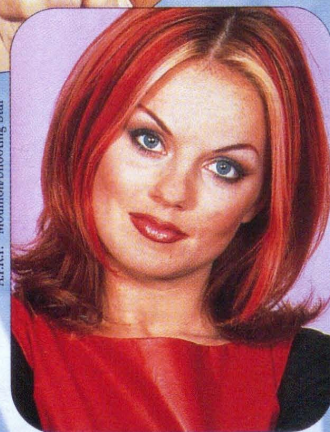

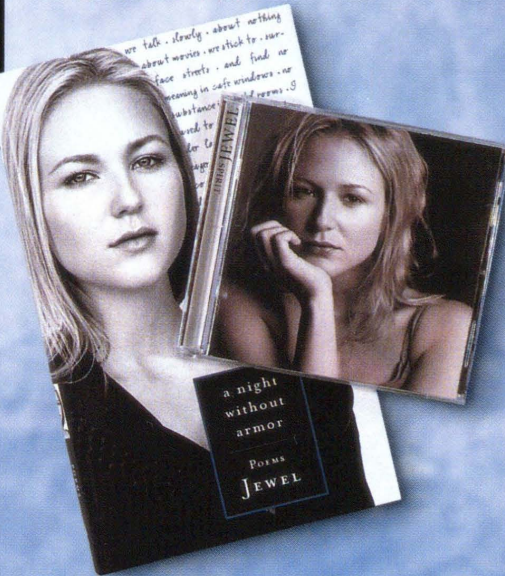

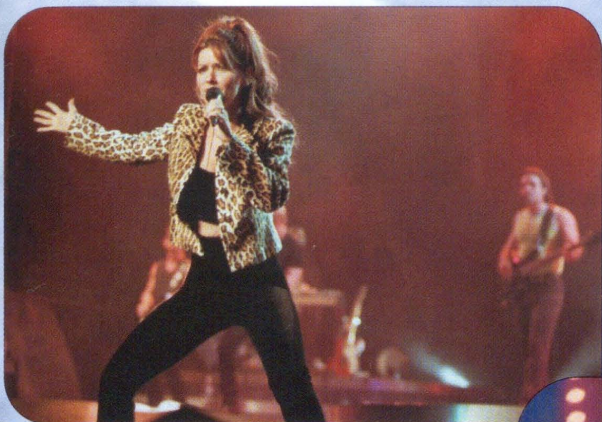

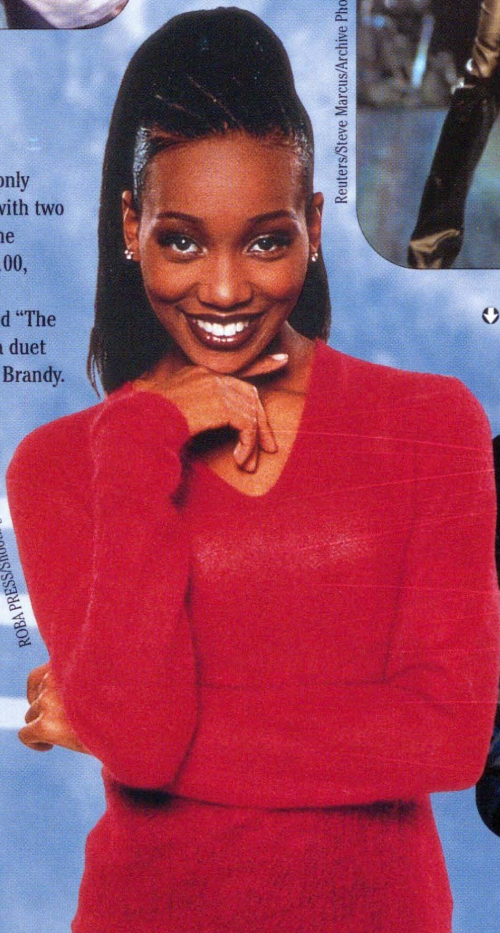

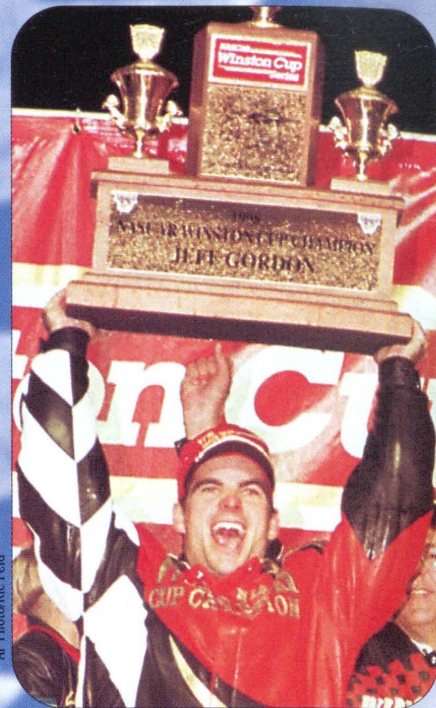

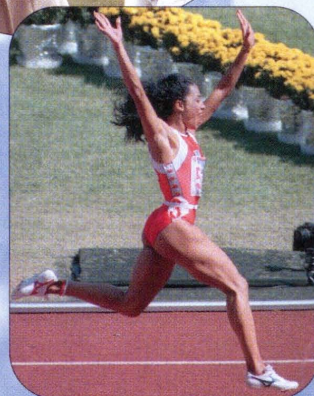

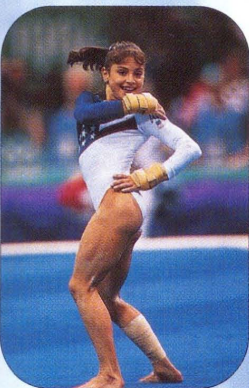

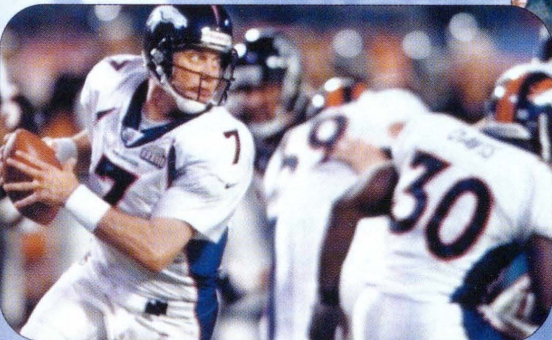

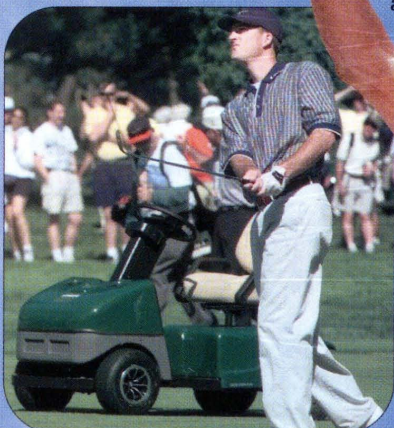

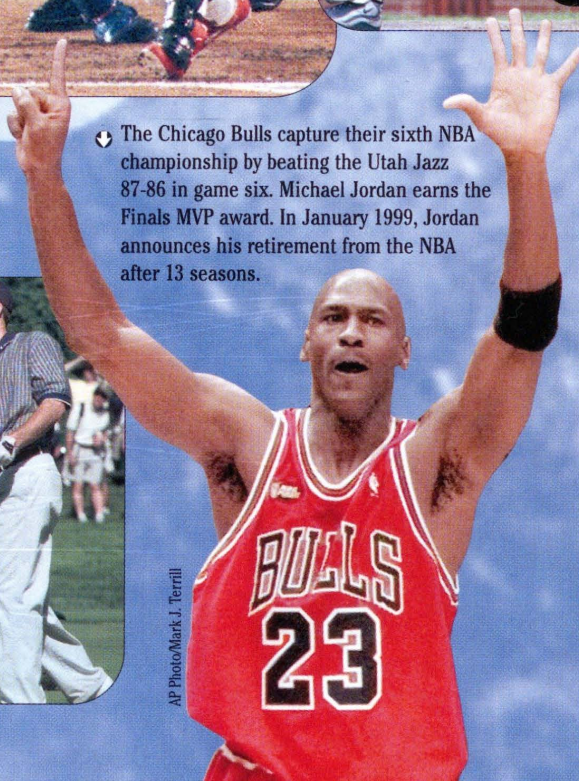

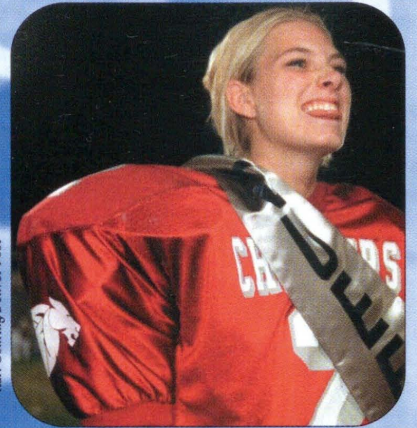
