## Indions Make Puorter-finals!!!

The 1989-90 Seneca High football team had a lot of skeptics when they started practice in the middle of August.
Through the heated 2-a-day practices the team worked hard and by the 1st game the Seneca Indians were ready to prove to the skeptics that this was to be their year.
Under Head Coach Tom Hodge, who had returned after a one-year absence, the offense developed into a scoring machine averaging 29 points and more than 330 yards a game in total offense.
The Indians were led by sophomore tailback Cheyenne Cummings who rushed for more than 1200 yards on 181 attempts for an average of more than 6 yards per carry and 15 touchdowns. The other half of the Indian rushing attack was Senior Gary Cummings who had 10 touchdowns and 700 yards on 126 attempts for an average of more than 5 yards per carry.
Senior Britt Burr, the starting quarterback through most of the season, provided the air attack for the Indians by throwing for more than 500 yards on 23 completions and 8 touchdowns while throwing only 1 interception. Burr also rushed for 260 yards on 37 attempts-an average of more than 7 yards per carry.
Senior end Korky Goettel was the receiving threat for the Indians, catching 22 passes for 585 yards and 10 touchdowns with an average of 27 yards per catch.
The Indian Defense proved to be the big plus for Seneca as they posted 6 shutouts and allowed only 7 touchdowns for the year. Allowing an av-
erage of 140 yards per game was enough for Head Defensive Coordinator Kendall Hunt's Indians to be ranked first in the entire 4-State area. The Indian Defense also was also ranked first in scoring by allowing only 48 points all year long for an average of 4 points a game. Gary Cummings and sophomore Jim Hoover led the Indians in tackles with 122 and 110 respectively.
Cheyenne Cummings led the defensive unit in turnover recoveries with 10 ( 6 interceptions and 4 fumble recoveries). Korky Goettel had 6 interceptions and a fumble recovery. Senior Jason Bard and Junior Rocky Ackerson had 3 interceptions and 3 fumble recoveries each.
Junior Brandon Nesvold provided the kicking services for the Indians by making 18 of 28 attempted extra points and adding a 35 -yard field goal.
Nesvold also was the starting quarterback for 3 games while Britt Burr was injured.
He completed 13 of 20 passes for 350 yards and 2 touchdowns.
The post-season went almost as well for the indians who outscored District opponents 123-6 in the final 3 games of the year.
Seneca started the State Playoffs off by beating the 6 th ranked Marionville Comets 29-0. The Indians were unranked at the time.
The Indians' opponent in the Quarter-final game was the 3rd ranked Warsaw Tigers.
It was a tough battle but an early score by the Tigers proved to be the difference as the Indians faced their 2 nd loss of the season by a score of 7-0.
The Indians finished the year with a 9-2 record, and
were ranked 5 th in the final state poll.
This year's Seniors finished with a 4 year record of 41 wins and 7 losses including 8 wins and 2 losses in the State Play-offs.
The Senior football players would like to extend a special thank you to all of the coaches, fans, and parents for their time, effort, and support. Also for making our teams both fun and successful throughout the years.

Although the SHS wrestling team didn't fare as well as expected, they still had a winning season. Up until midway through the season the Indians had 12 wrestlers to fill the 13 weight categories. Out of these, seven were first-year varsity wrestlers. Toward the end of the season, however, the Indians lost five wrestlers to injuries; the final duals, therefore, were wrestled with only seven wrestlers to the other teams' thirteen.
