SHS Fall Sports



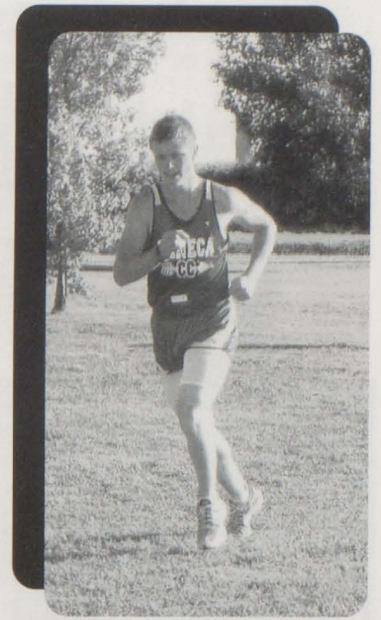

Although the team didn't maintain a winning record during the season, Plake remained 100% confident in his players. They were committed and dedicated to the success of the team and showed steady improvement.

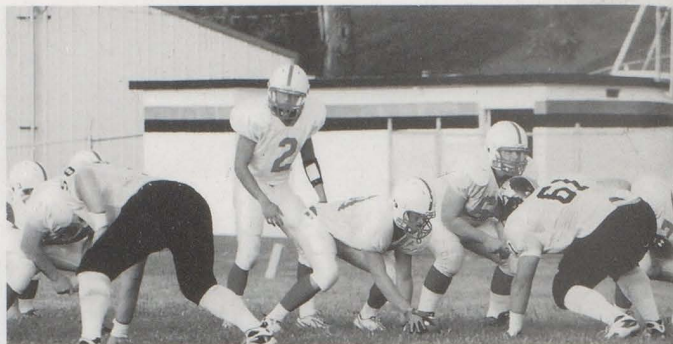

--This saves you from permanent hair damage.

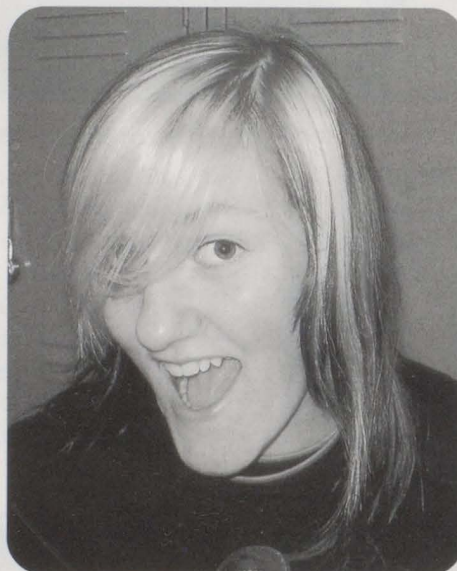

BE YOURSELF

It is said that high school is that period of time where teenagers find who they really are. During the last four years of their free public education, most students change their appearance often.
